During Wellbeing Week, we supported a cause that is very close to our hearts. Ian Daly was a pupil in our school when he developed cancer. He was in 5<sup>th</sup> class when he died. We remember Ian as a fun-loving, brave boy who loved life. His parents, Brian and Laura, have shown enormous courage and strength in creating an annual event that not only keeps Ian's name alive, but raises invaluable funds for Barretstown and Crumlin Hospital. This event is one that will be familiar to most of you – the annual Swim-A-Mile-With-A-Smile. In Scoil

Mochua, in an effort to include more children and really highlight the cause, we have turned the event into an annual Walk-A-Mile. In early April, classes from 2<sup>nd</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> did a local walk, decked out in blue or yellow (both colours represent the charity). Many thanks to Ms Smith and Ms Daly who coordinated this event throughout the school, and many thanks to all of the parents who accompanied the classes on the walks. Thanks to your generosity, we raised €1,300. All proceeds will be presented to Brian and Laura and will go directly to Barretstown and Crumlin Hospital. ### SUPPORTING CHILDREN WHO ARE RELUCTANT TO ATTEND SCHOOL

School should be a happy, safe place for children, but it is not unusual for children to feel uneasy about going to school now and again. However, if your child begins to regularly experience strong feelings such as reluctance about going to school or have difficulty staying in school, it is important to notice this and respond quickly.

Working with your child's class teacher from the beginning is essential in supporting them while they feel like this. There is excellent advice in a new booklet developed by the National Educational Psychological Service (NEPS). This is available on our website at the link below.

### ALL TOGETHER NOW

In May, students in 5th and 6th classes will be participating in the All Together Now programme. All Together Now is composed of four lessons based on the SPHE curriculum for

5th and 6th classes in primary schools. The lessons take an equality and human rights approach to respect, inclusion and homophobic and transphobic bullying.

The CPSMA (Catholic Primary Schools Management Association) has approved the use of this programme in Catholic primary schools.

The lesson plans for All Together Now include slides, scenarios, discussion questions and other tools for teaching pupils. Pupils are taught about types of identity-based bullying (based on the nine grounds of the Equality Acts and the DES Action Plan on Bullying.) They are also taught about bullying behaviours such as verbal, physical, cyber or social isolation.

We will be continuing to encourage reading here in school by using the remainder of the sponsorship money, less the Readathon expenses, to add new and exciting titles to our class libraries and to further diversify our collection of class novels.

#### FREE SCHOOL BOOK SCHEME

In line with the new Government policy on school books, parents no longer have to pay for school books or copies. This is welcome news for all, and long overdue. We will be sourcing all school books, copies, folders, journals, mini white boards etc. for the coming year. Information on this scheme is available <u>here</u>.

We will continue to charge a much-reduced fee for School Charges. This will be standard throughout the school and will cover the following:

- Photocopying €15
- Art and Craft Materials €15
- ICT €15
- Pupil Insurance (24 hour) €9

The total for all children will be €54, which represents a significant reduction. All other materials that previously fell under the heading of School Charges will be covered by the Government grant. We will issue a payment link for the School Charges in due course.

### ARRIVING TO SCHOOL SAFELY

We encourage children to walk, cycle or scoot to school. It is healthy, green and a great way to start the day. Please remind children to be careful when crossing the road. We have a zebra crossing beside the school, and a separate crossing with a traffic warden (the lollipop lady). If children are approaching the school from that side, please remind them that they should cross the road either at the zebra-crossing or with the lollipop lady. The zebra crossing is ideally located for those who have to enter via the gate at the green. Children should avoid crossing the main road at an earlier point in an effort to make the journey slightly shorter.

Lessons with Tom and Rachel, the gardeners, resumed with 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> classes last week.
