## Change of School Start Time

We have been monitoring the start times over a number of weeks before the mid-term break, and the vast majority of children, in all classes, are in school by 9.10am. The level of supervision required at gates, at all doors into the school, and on all corridors every morning is no longer justified for the small numbers arriving between 9.10am and 9.20am. For this reason, we ask that from next Monday, $8^{\text {th }}$ November, all children should be in school by 9.10am. Formal teaching will commence at that time in all classes. From next Monday, $8^{\text {th }}$ November, all children should arrive from 8.50am - 9.10am.

## Absenteeism

Non-Covid Related Absences
If your child is absent from school, please send a note to the class teacher on his / her return to school, noting the reason for the absence. For Senior Infants $-6^{\text {th }}$ class, the absence notes are in the back of the homework journal. As Junior Infants do not have a journal, please email the teacher on your child's return, stating the reason for the absence. All absences are recorded on our administration system, and the reasons for the absence are also recorded. (There are particularly important when the number of absences surpass 20 days). Roll call is taken at 10am every morning. Any child not in attendance at that time will be marked absent. If your child has a morning appointment, and will be arriving to school after 10am, please inform the class teacher in advance.

Covid-related absences are dealt with in a slightly different manner. Please alert the class teacher, via email, as soon as possible if your child's absence is covid-related, i.e. your child has Covid symptoms and is awaiting medical advice / a Covid test, your child is a close contact of a confirmed case and has been advised by Public Health to restrict movement, or your child tests positive for Covid. This will allow the teacher to mark the absence as Covid-related on our system.

The school is obliged to report all absences of over 20 school days to Tusla. This is automatically generated by the online system. Covid-related absences are NOT included in the 20 days.

## Return to School Declaration Form

Part of our Covid prevention measures in school is the Return to School Form. We acknowledge that this is yet another thing that busy parents have to remember to do in advance of their child returning to school after an absence. However, it is part of a suite of measures that have helped, to date, to keep the school community safe. Please submit this form after every short absence from school. This is in addition to the note in the journal or email explaining the absence. ## Covid

As you are well aware from the media, there is currently no contact tracing in school when a positive case arises. However, we feel it is important to keep you updated should there be a case in your child's class. This is not to alarm people, rather it allows you to be extra vigilant to any symptoms your child might develop. Symptom-free children should continue to attend school. We need your permission to inform the parents in your child's class (obviously no names will be shared) and we would appreciate your support with this. In short, please inform us if your child tests positive, and we will ask for permission to inform the rest of the class of the confirmed case.

## Homeless Street Café

A parent in our school, Denise Carroll, runs the Homeless Street Café. Denise and a team of helpers provide much needed hot meals, clothes and other essential supplies to many less fortunate people on the streets of Dublin.

We know that the children had a great time Trick or Treating at Halloween, and we have heard of large bags of treats stashed away at home! If you have surplus treats, or perhaps some that your child is not too fond of, please send them to school in a bag, and we will collect them for the Homeless Street Café. ## Code of Behaviour Review

We have completed our annual review of the Code of Behaviour. All staff were involved in this review, as were the outgoing Parents' Association. We will be dedicating a night or two of
homework next week to the Code of Behaviour. We will highlight the part of the policy that we would like you to read and discuss with your child. We will also spend time on it in class. We will facilitate you to submit any comments or feedback that you might have, and this feedback will be taken into account for the next review of the policy. We believe that a successful Code of Behaviour is one that is discussed, understood and consistently applied. Discussing the policy at home, in an age appropriate way, with your child/children, while we also discuss it in school, ensures a consistent home-school approach to a vitally important aspect of school life.

We will issue further details on this important homework next week.

## School Life

We had a busy, happy September and October in school. Many classes enjoyed Basketball with our coach, David Donnelly, and GAA coaching with the club PRO Jonathan Daniels. The $5^{\text {th }}$ class children are making great strides with their weekly Cycle Safety lessons. All classes are participating in lots of outdoor PE lessons and games.
